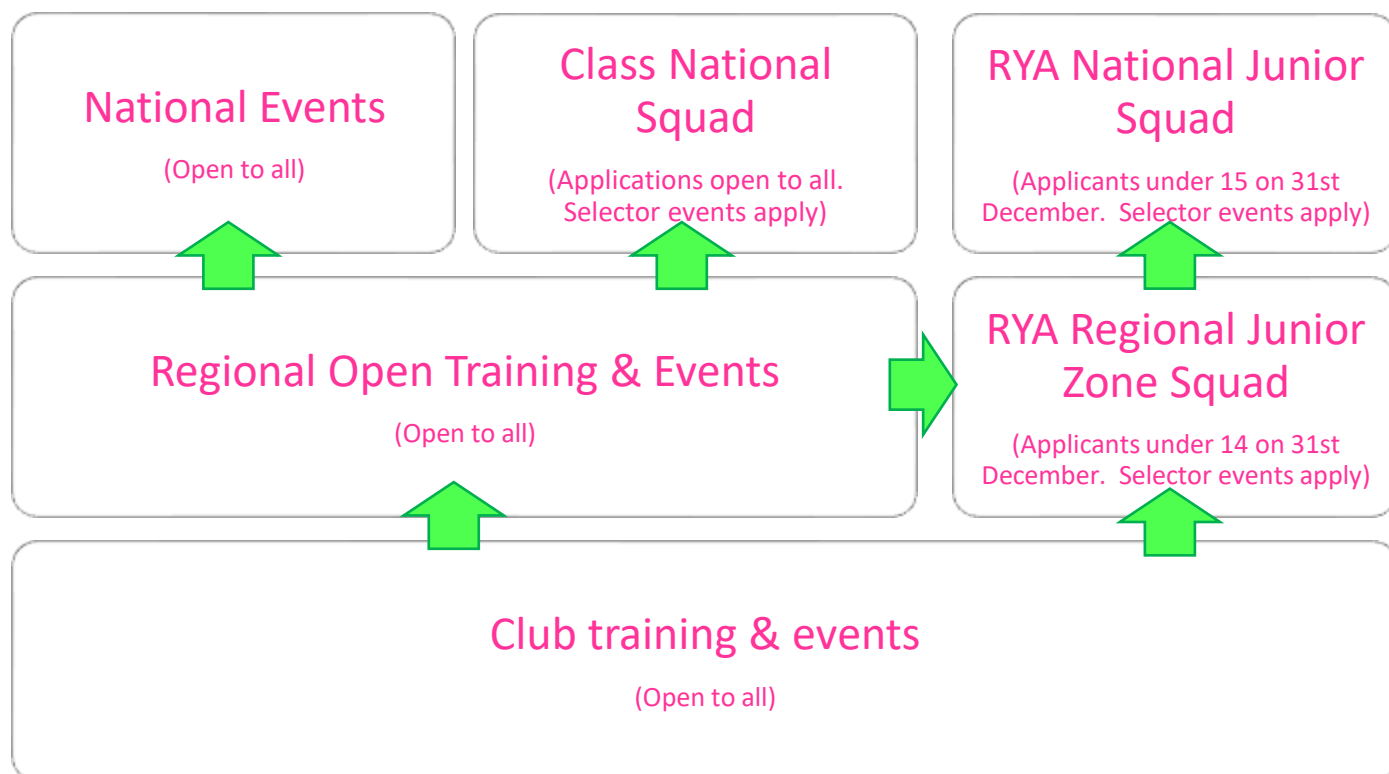


# RS Feva Training & Events

## 1) Training and events pathway:

Rough guide as each sailor, club and regional situation will vary slightly.

Aim of this is to enable sailors and parents to see a progression through from clubs, to access regional and national training and events, alongside opportunities within RYA Squads.



## 2) Club training and events

- Access to the RS Feva Club Training/Event Package to make it easy to host (see packages).
- Aim to introducing new sailors to the class and providing training for current class sailors.
- Allow individual bookings, providing club boats are available, so that sailors can meet potential partners?
- Training to be non-restrictive (i.e. training for all).
- Encourage club sailors to attend regional training and events to support other clubs and sailor development.

## 3) Regional open training and events

- Coordinated by Regional Reps and clubs with support from the RS Class Association.
- Clubs access to the Event/Training Package to make it easy to host (see packages).
- Regional Rep group club open events to make a regional traveller series.
- Pre-arranged dates for winter open training within each zone. 4 weekends cross-referenced with other class events and training to enable maximum attendance. RS Feva Class Association to co-ordinate weekends with area rep.
- Option for each zone to run additional training as suits the demand within the region. Access to association resources such as our packages.
- Introduce opportunities for sailors within RYA Regional/National Squads, CNS and national events.
- Broadening network of sailors/parents/friends to provide additional support when travelling to events.

All you need to do...	Spread the word (members, local clubs, potential members) Confirm maximum numbers of entries you can take with the RS Feva Class Association Allocate club boats to members booking training (as applicable) Book resources (e.g. powerboats, classrooms, whiteboard/flipchart, safety crew, race officer). Coordinate with galley/kitchen to provide food and refreshments. Ensure a club member is there to open the club and lock up at the end of the day.

#### 5) Regional Rep role and responsibilities

- Main point of contact for regional event and training enquiries.
- Communicate with clubs – encourage to access our training and event packages to be a host.
- Coordinate traveller series with clubs.
- Coordinate winter open training with clubs (dates allocated by the RS Feva Class Association so only need clubs matched with weekends available).
- Feedback to the RS Feva Association any areas for development or additional support required.

#### 6) Increasing participation at training and events

- Open to all policy – no age restrictions. Encourage pro-am and parent-child pairings.
- Prepare packages of resources for clubs to access to make it easier for clubs to host, saving preparation time and increasing uptake.
- Increase regional reps and provide clear job role so it is much easier to action.
- Run training alongside other classes (as appropriate).
- Support parents new to the sport with workshops i.e. effective towing, safety boat crew and shore crew.
